

Be Ready for Emergencies!

Emergency Kit

- Bring your emergency kit with you to a shelter
- Make sure you have your medications
- Take your emergency form and list of emergency contacts



Evacuation Route and Shelters

- Learn your community's evacuation routes
- Know where your shelter is
 - If you have pets, take them with you to a shelter that accepts animals
 - Use the Red Cross website to see which shelters are open



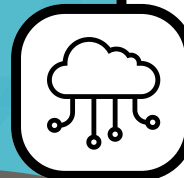
Stay Connected

- Charge all electronic devices
- Have backup power sources
- Keep a list of emergency contacts



Stay Informed

- Monitor weather forecasts and announcements from your county's emergency management agency
- Check news stations



Emergency Kit Checklist

Water

Bottled water. One gallon per person, per day, for at least 14 days, for drinking and sanitation.

Food

Nonperishable food, a manual can opener, and basic utensils. A supply of at least 14 days of food per person.

Radio & Flashlight

Keep a flashlight and a radio, plus extra batteries, for listening to news and weather.

Electronics

Bring items such as cell phones, laptops or tablets, and solar chargers.

Health & Medical Supplies

Have at least 2 weeks' worth of any prescription medicines you're taking and any health supplies you typically need.

Clothes

Collect one change of clothes and footwear per person. Pack blankets and special gear in case of severe weather.

Hygiene & Personal Care Items

Basics like soap, toilet paper, toothpaste, and toothbrush. Bring garbage bags and plastic ties for sanitary disposal.

First Aid & Safety Supplies

Basics such as antiseptic, masks/gloves, bandages, non-prescription medicines, and a multipurpose tool.

Cash & Documents

Important documents and enough money (in small bills) to purchase extra food, water, or other items, for at least 14 days. Store these items in a waterproof pouch.

Supplies for Unique Needs

Remember to plan for family members with unique needs (e.g., elderly, disability, infants/toddlers, pets).
